Topic 1 hour per day	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Monday: look at a few famous paintings and say what you like or dislike about them. Describe how the artist has painted water- eg, using short or long brush strokes, points, or dots, etc. Describe what colours are used and what materials and techniques the artist may have used (eg, did he use paintbrushes, sticks, etc.) (look at pictures from Monet, Seurat, Renoir and Hockney on PPT provided) • Tuesday: Look at the work of Claude Monet (PPT provided) and his paintings of the lily pond at his garden at Giverny in France. Create your own Monet-style picture of a garden pond and waterlilies using paint if you have it or crayons or coloured pencils. • Wednesday: Look at the work of Georges Seurat (PPT provided) and use a fine paint brush or objects other than paintbrushes to create a simple water picture based on the “Pontillist” style- eg, cotton buds, a cut potato, a small piece of sponge, piece of cork, etc. • Thursday: Look at the work of David Hockney (PPT provided) and create your own painting of a swimmer in a swimming pool in Summer • Friday: Look at Monet’s work again and how he painted the same scene at different times of the day. Try painting or colouring a seascape or river picture during the day and at night with moonlight- see Monet’s moonlight picture as an example. If you have no paint to hand, use chalks, crayons, felt tips or colouring pencils, if available.
