

English

We will look at a variety of genres and use known texts to craft our own pieces:

- Narrative Text – Roman Myth
- Diary entry – The mysterious journey of Edward Tulane
- Non-chronological report – a newspaper report on the eruption of Vesuvius .

History

We will learn about Roman settlements and the impact of the Roman Empire on Britain. Children will immerse themselves in Roman daily life and take part in a Trip to the Roman Baths.

Science

We will be exploring how sound is created, pitch and volume and looking at hearing through the ear. We will also be investigating electricity and making our own simple circuits.

Following on from our Unit exploring Hindu beliefs we will be looking at the question 'What does it mean to be a Hindu in Britain today?'

Mathematics

We will be learning how to multiply and divide using mental and formal written methods. We will also be developing our knowledge on decimals and fractions and calculating area.
